Using relevant examples, analyse any four critical foundations of Poetry in Africa


QUESTION FOUR (20 MARKS)

QUESTION THREE (20 MARKS)


With illustrations from Ezekiel Alembi's *Elijah Masinde: Rebel with a Cause*, explain how theory informs interpretations of Children's Literature.
