- a) For each of the following sounds, provide the indicated articulatory parameters:
  - i. [p] Manner of articulation
  - ii. [G] Phonation type
  - iii. [‡] Airstream mechanism
  - iv. [h] Cavity
  - v. [s] Stricture type
  - vi. [d] Airstream mechanism
  - vii. [v] Manner of articulation
  - viii. [x] Place or articulation
  - ix. [n] Cavity
  - x. [e] Lip rounding (10 marks)
- b) With appropriate examples, discuss three assimilatory and two non-assimilatory phonological processes in any other language apart from English. (20 marks)

## **QUESTION TWO (20 MARKS)**

- a) Drawing examples from English and any other languages of your choice, demonstrate how features may be distinctive in one language and redundant in another. (8 marks)
- b) Explain any THREE types of distinctive oppositions (8 marks)

## **QUESTION THREE (20 MARKS)**
